

We couldn't do it without the eyes and ears, diversity and passion of our dedicated board members and I hope that everyone recognizes the impact that their commitment to this board has brought to the children of now and the generations that follow. A special shout out to our staff, in particular Rebecca and Kate for their continued efforts, as we know it has been an uphill battle and their love and passion for this field can be, at times, all-consuming and frustrating. You have, and continue to impact so many lives!

### **Report from our Executive Directors**

Well, that was another incredibly fast and busy year. This is our second year pulling together an annual report and we find it very rewarding to make note of how much our small team accomplished over the year. This year we continued to deliver our well-known Partners for Children parenting groups and entered our second year of our Quality Roots ELCC Yukon Programs project. One of the highlights for the 23-24 fiscal year happened in February 2024 when we were able to hire a Family Resource Centre Coordinator and open our Family Resource Centre to parents of young children. This has been an item very high on our bucket list for many many years and we were thrilled to see that come to fruition. So far, the response to the Centre has been amazing! This Centre was made possible due to a continued funding agreement with the Health and Social Services Department at the Yukon Government.

We would very much like to thank our small but mighty staff and contractors who provide fantastic support to Yukon families and/or dedication to their roles with the organization. We would also like to thank our NHEHDY Board of Directors for their continued input and support. And last but definitely not least we would like to thank all of the families who come out to our programs, and to the child care centres who value quality programming and have embraced the Quality Roots program.

#### **Partners for Children**

#### **Parenting Groups**

Our Parenting Groups continued to be immensely popular. Groups were full, often within two minutes of registration opening. This was particularly true for Parent Child Mother Goose and Infant Massage groups. Our Haines Junction Romp N Run program continued to be very much in demand and every session was at maximum capacity.



In the 23-24 fiscal year we delivered:

- **6 Parent-Child Mother Goose groups** (total of 60 sessions). Our partners were the Child Development Centre, Whitehorse Public Library, the Healthy Babies Healthy Futures program at Victoria Faulkner Women's Centre and the Family Resource Unit at YG.
- **5 Mothering Your Baby groups** (total of 30 sessions). Our partners were the Canadian Mental Health Association Yukon, Mental Wellness and Substance Use at YG and. the Healthy Babies Healthy Futures program at Victoria Faulkner Women's Centre.
- **2 Infant Massage groups** (total of 12 sessions). Our partner was the Healthy Babies Healthy Futures program at Victoria Faulkner Women's Centre.
- **1 Nobody's Perfect Parenting Group** (total of 6 sessions). Our partner was the Family Resource Unit at YG.
- **3 Seasons of Romp N Run** groups in Haines Junction (total of 62 sessions). Several community facilitators provided the programming for these groups, along with staff from the Child Development Centre, Family Literacy Centre and the Public Library. Special events were held in June to celebrate year end, and at Halloween and Christmas.





### **Trainings**

This year we offered a Parent Child Mother Goose Teacher Training to 9 individuals in December 2023. Participants were from the Polarettes Gymnastics Club, Skookum Jim Friendship Centre CPNP Program, Healthy Babies Healthy Futures Program at VFWC and the Early Years Program at the Yukon First Nation Education Directorate.

### A Message from our Family Programs Facilitator and Trainer – Jo Lukawitski


This past year feels like a blur! It feels like so much has happened, and when I look at what we did, I see that yes, so much DID happen!

Parent Child Mother Goose saw a wonderful return to some of our old places. For the first time in a long time (pre-covid), we brought the program back to the Library and to the Child Development Centre; and for the first time in a very long time, we partnered with the Family Literacy Centre! It was so wonderful to bring songs and rhymes back into these spaces and to see the trickle effects on passersby as well as onlooking staff (later caught singing the songs!).

When I think of the Infant Massage program, the word blossoming comes to mind. This program started out shy and tentatively, with wonder as to whether there would be many participants. I remember Fall the previous year, trying to fill the group and wondering if we'd have enough interest from folks to make it happen. Fast forward to this spring, the classes filling up instantaneously on EventBrite and the growing sense that we could easily double our offerings.

Mothering Your Baby had its highs and its lows. A huge high was feeling the support from the staff at the Whitehorse Health Clinic again. And a personal high - making a new friend and being inspired by my wonderful co-facilitator Jade Halycon in the January/February program from the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHAY). Which leads me to the low – the crashing and crumbling of CMHAY. Witnessing an exodus of 9 colleagues, plus the ED. The temporary loss of a partnership. The loss of an important resource in our community. Uncertainty for our future together.

I see Whitehorse growing and the insatiable demand for more programs and supports like the ones we offer at the Family Programs. It excites me to know that we trained so many others to deliver Parent Child Mother Goose, and I feel relief in knowing that program will expand. I also feel gratitude to NHEHD for giving me the opportunity to study and become certified in Perinatal Mental Health. With my international badge from PSI, I feel more confident supporting families. Thank you!



#### Family Drop-In/Family Resource Centre

Thanks to funding from Health and Social Services at the Yukon Government we were able to complete more renovations to our programming space, to hire a new Family Resource Centre Coordinator, to open the doors of our new Family Resource Centre, and to purchase materials and resources for the Centre. Funds were also used for the rent of the programming space and utility costs.

In the programming space we were able to

- Build large storage cupboards in the back area
- Replace the concrete pad under the oil tank
- Replace all the lighting with softer LED lights
- Pay for a parking lot extension to accommodate three more vehicles

Between April 1<sup>st</sup> and June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, we offered Open Drop in (2 hours) several days a week in our programming space. During this time a few parents and children stopped by, but the overall uptake was low. Due to being unable to fill a Family Resource Centre Coordinator position (due to lack of funding stability), the Centre was not open from July 2023 to February 2024. On March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024 our Family Resource Centre officially opened for its first drop in and has been very popular so far. We are very pleased with attendance so far and are keeping close track of comments and requests being made by families.



## A Message from our Family Resource Centre Coordinator – Marianne Goebel (began working with Partners for Children on March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024)

One of the major highlights in the first month of my work was the successful establishment and operation of the Family Resource Centre. During March, the Centre was open 2-3 days a week, with plans to extend to daily operation once our Family Programs concluded. The initial weeks were dedicated to establishing a routine for general facility operations and programming during drop-in hours. These routines have been instrumental in creating a structured flow that can be easily maintained in the future for anyone working in the Centre.

Another notable success is the creation of our lending library. We now have over 100 books available for parents and caregivers, covering a wide range of topics including child development, parenting, pregnancy and birthing, perinatal mental health, and children's books. There is an easy checkout and return process to keep track of all assets, and we also accept book donations. This resource has been greatly appreciated by our community, providing valuable information and support to families.

#### **Personal Reflections**

Reflecting on the first few weeks of operation, I am immensely proud of what we have achieved. The establishment of the Family Resource Centre has not only met a crucial need in our community but has also created a welcoming space for families to access support and resources. Witnessing the impact of our lending library on families, seeing them engage with the resource wall, and knowing that we are making a difference in their lives has been one of my favorite successes. The positive feedback from parents and caregivers has also been incredibly rewarding and has been focused around being one of the few spaces in the territory that was designed specifically for infants and small children. Parents have made supportive friendships in our Centre, and watching their babies learn, socialize and grow with one another is another reason why this Centre makes such a positive impact in the community.


#### **Challenges and Future Aspirations**

A major challenge has been our inability to reach families who work during regular business hours and have children in daycare. Extending our hours to include evenings or weekends in the future would be a huge benefit to families who are not on maternity or parental leave but would also require additional staff or reallocation of current hours of operation. In the future, the Centre would like to partner with more practitioners, specialists, and field experts on a variety of child development and parenting topics. Having drop-in "Ask An Expert" programming would be a way to increase parental knowledge on selected topics in a low barrier way. We also currently have a partnership with an organization to provide menstrual products, and are discussing the possibility of having other family planning tools such as ovulation and pregnancy tests. We are very excited about the future of the Family Resource Centre and cannot wait to see what this upcoming year holds.

#### **Other Partners for Children Projects**

With the funding from Health and Social Services at the Yukon Government we were also able to continue to provide Partners for Children staff with a competitive wage and health benefits. This funding also helped to cover the costs of a few other projects this fiscal year. These included:

#### **Quality Roots – ELCC Yukon Programs**


While still making beautiful progress, the project has been challenging. As you know, the mentorship position did not come to fruition because the CDC's Early Learning Program Support (ELPS) mentorship for inclusion came to life before our project got off the ground, which meant redundancy and also difficulty finding a staff person to fill our position.

Since we started our program there has been a deluge of on the floor support coming from all directions (CDC, YG's ELCC Unit, us, YFNED, YU). It has been somewhat overwhelming for programs to continuously have visitors providing them with insight, and has left us at times feeling awkward as we try not to be an overwhelming presence.

One of the highlights that has arisen is the question "What is Quality ELCC in the Yukon"? Our project utilizes the ITERS and ECERS (Infant Toddler Environment Rating Scale and the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale). There has been some response that it doesn't feel like a fit for some programs. We have heard that some have a problem with it being a "checklist", and/oran observation instead of mentorship... but we have a sense that some are feeling uncomfortable with being given feedback, suggestions and outsider insight, no matter how positive it is. Every program that has been visited has been unique in its own way and a good place for children and families. The project has brought exciting and measurable changes to those programs who have had second and third visits, after the initial observation visit.

Another highlight of the year was being able to introduce and provide Pyramid Model Infants and Toddlers training to 99 participants and then TPiTOS reliability training to 22 participants. The presentation regarding the project at an ECE YT gathering in April 2023 was also a great way to connect with 21 child care programs.

Moving forward in 24-25 we will be continuing to offer our Family Programs, Family Resource Centre, Quality Roots Project and Facilitator/Teacher Trainings.

#### **Partners for Children**

#### Parenting Groups and Facilitator/Teacher Trainings

In 24-25 we will continue to offer our parenting programs: Parent Child Mother Goose, Mothering Your Baby, Infant Massage, Handle with Care, Nobody's Perfect Parenting Program and Romp N Run Haines Junction.

A Parent Child Mother Goose Program® Teacher Training is planned for early September 2024. Other trainings will be planned based on demand. Refresher sessions will be offered to facilitators and teachers that have been trained by the Partners for Children program.

Our current contract with the Public Health Agency of Canada will end on March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026. Discussions regarding the renewal process continue and submission of proposals for funding beyond 2026 will begin in the Fall of 2024.

#### **Family Resource Centre**

In 2024-25 the Centre will be open on a daily basis for families to stop in. A variety of different guests, topics of discussion and play experiences will be incorporated into the schedule.

#### **Quality Roots ELCC Yukon Programs**

Our focus during the 24-25 fiscal year will continue to be to:

- Promote the program and encourage centres and ECE's to register for the program
- Offer quality assessments and mentoring in child care centres
- Offer a two-day session in November 2024 to discuss what quality is and to visit different early learning and child care programs in Whitehorse.
- Publish editions of the Quality News
- Provide continuing education opportunities
- Wrap up the project starting in January 2025 unless funding to continue is found
